Betty Journey Estep Carr was a long-lived native of Pulaski, Giles County, Tennessee and widow of J W Carr. Betty is survived by her daughters Sherry Estep Taylor (Ron) and Carla Carr Johnson (Matt). Preceding Betty in death were her parents Paul Journey, Emma Lilly Walls Journey and brothers Dale and Wayne Journey.

She would later open her own place of business and work as a Beautician in Pulaski as well as invest in Giles County Real Estate for many years to come. Betty and J W also combined their efforts to begin a new joint business endeavor, Carr and Erwin Funeral Home, that would be a lifelong legacy for J W Carr and Bobby Erwin in Pulaski, Tennessee.
