James S. Thompson of Pulaski, TN passed away on Monday October 11, 2021 at Southern Tennessee Regional in Lawrenceburg. He was born on November 18, 1946 in Pulaski, TN. and was 74 years old.

Jimmy was a loving husband, father and papa. He was employed by the City of Pulaski as Fire Chief from May 26, 1994 till his retirement on Dec 31, 2011. He also served as the first Fire Chief of the Elkton Fire Dept and helped establish Elkton's Fire Department. He continued to work part-time as a building inspector for the City of Pulaski. He was very proud to be a contributor of one of his prize wood creations to be auctioned at the annual fund raising ceremony at the Tennessee Fire Chiefs Association where he served as President and a long-time member and for The Tennessee Fire Safety Inspectors Association. He served as Director of the Tennessee State Fire School in Murfreesboro TN, and as an Instructor with the Tennessee Fire Service and Codes Enforcement Academy. He was a wood turner and a life-long friend of Blue Grass. He was veteran of the United States Army.

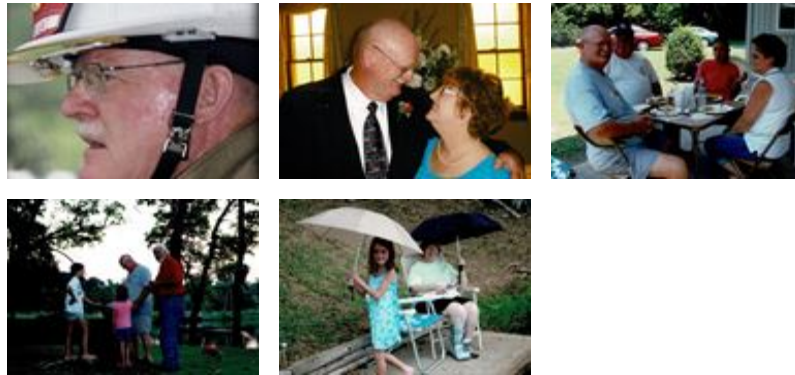

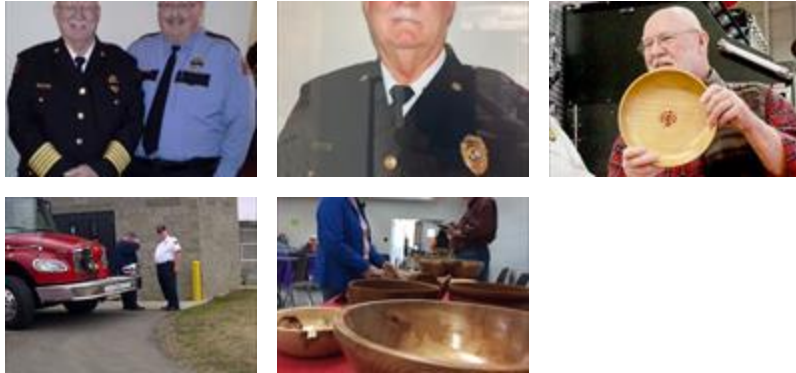
