



Kathryn Malone Paulk

November 5, 1907 - March 24, 2012

Kathryn Malone Paulk, of Pulaski, passed away March 24, 2012 at Crockett Hospital in Lawrenceburg.

She was born on November 5, 1907 in Minor Hill Tennessee and was 104 years old.

She was owner of Paulk's Bakery, secretary of First United Methodist Church of Pulaski, and executive secretary of the Giles County draft board during world war II. She graduating from Martin in 1926 and attended business college in Bowling Green, Ky. After meeting and marrying John Buford Paulk in 1929, the couple moved back to Pulaski. Contributing to her long life, she advised to not worry about every little thing, and she would rather give than receive. Mrs Paulk's whole life has been of caring for others and serving in the community whenever she was needed. "I have always had an open-door policy at my home," Paulk said.

Private graveside services will be held. A memorial service will be held Wednesday, March 28th at 11:00am at First United Methodist Church, 200 West Jefferson Street, Pulaski, Tennessee.
