Morris Harwell Mitchell passed away on Tuesday, January 19, 2016 at his home in the Friendship Community. He was born at home in Giles County on February 9, 1944 and was 71 years old.

He was a graduate of Beech Hill High School, Martin College, and received his B.S. and M.A. from MTSU. He was a classroom teacher for 27 years and a guidance counselor for 15 years, most of those at Richland High School. He also was a coach for many of those years. Morris was a member of the Church Street Church of Christ in Lewisburg, TN. He cherished his family and friends, Playing golf, and his woodworking. He made decorative wooden bowls and pepper mills. Though he never sold any, he gave many away.
