7 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren.

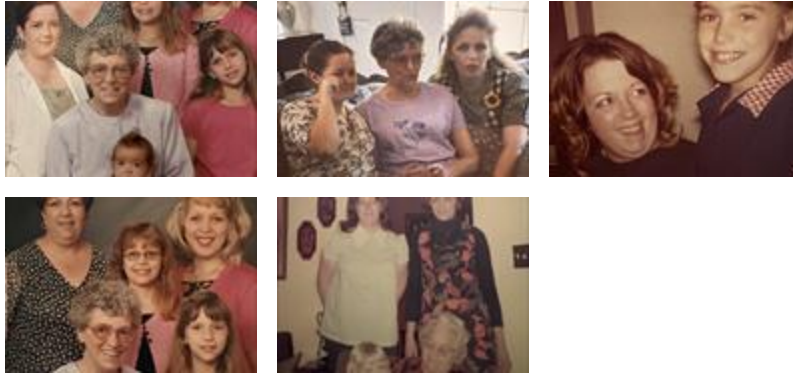
Sisters, Laura Young and Randy Roberts both of Tacoma, Washington also

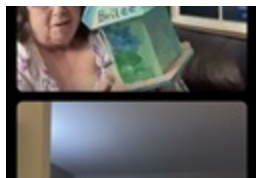
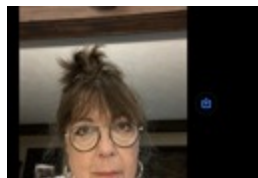
